THE GARDEN MASTERPLAN

The garden will be a place for the Pensioners to share or to enjoy quiet reflection. It is designed as a private vet accessible space to be enjoyed by different generations, fostering a spirit of participation and keeping active in later years.

01. OAK ARCHES

Made from layers of British-grown oak, the arches have been made in the UK using locally sourced timber.

INSECT HOTEL

Designed by The Snowdon School of Furniture, part of the King's Foundation, the insect hotel, encourages solitary bees to find a home within the garden.



INTERNAL PLANTING

Inside the garden planting is muted, textural and green with subtle flowering in shades of blue and white. This reflects the private lives of the pensioners who wear a blue uniform when not on duty.



FEATURE WALL

Made from aged, reclaimed bricks to reflect existing garden walls at the Royal Hospital, the top half of the wall is perforated to allow views from within the garden to the Royal Hospital in the background.



Hospital was originally pumped from the River Thames and stored in lead tanks - now used as planters. Inspired by the tanks the water feature, recreates the design - with flowing water to add sound and movement in the garden.

HANDMADE MAP TABLE

A key part of military life is being posted worldwide on duty and to reflect this The Snowdon School of Furniture, part of the King's Foundation, were commissioned to design and make the table as a centrepiece. EDGE PLANTING

To the edges of the garden the planting palette is vibrant and bright with purples, pinks and reds. This reflects the ceremonial lives of the Chelsea Pensioners in their famous scarlet uniforms.

SOCIAL BENCH

The social bench is the main focal point at the heart of the garden. Made from British Oak, the curved shape of the bench provides an inviting and welcoming place for the Chelsea Pensioners and their guests to socialise. The bench design reflects the colonnade seating in Figure Court at the Royal Hospital, with hand-turned legs and fluting to



match the panelling.

SCARLET UNIFORM CUSHIONS

Working with prisoners' rehabilitation charity Fine Cell Work, striking cushions were made for the social bench by recycling old scarlet uniforms worn by the Pensioners, with brass buttons and insignia incorporated in the design.
